AUGUST

BOARD OF GOVERNOR'S MEETING

The BOG convened at the Sand Springs Community Center on 07 April 2008. Governors present were Ray Adams, Kenny Baggett, Tina Birch, Jo Ann Chandler, Terry Dannar, Steve Elliott, Tucky Patz, and Earl Stroud.

WELCOME: Terry called the meeting to order at 6:25 pm and welcomed members David Briggs, Rex Donley, Darline Hobock, Steve Horn, Doug Lewis, Fred Morgan, Elizabeth Paszkiewicz, Elaine Rainey, and Steve Snider.

Steve Horn announced that three volunteers have started the application process for the Type 54, User of Fireworks, ATF Explosives License certification.

A Vandalism Committee has been formed to address the needs of our Club. This committee will develop actions to be taken to protect our properties and present their ideas to the BOG for implementation. Currently the Committee recommends that the club adopt a new rule concerning dependents and after lengthy discussion, Kenny made a motion that "At times other than scheduled Club events, dependents of members need to be accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult after 8pm unless prior arrangements have been made by the parents with a member of the Board of Governors or the Facilities Manager."; Earl seconded the motion: the motion passed. The Vandalism Committee will meet with Terry before the next BOG meeting to present to him their full recommendations.

Steve Snider updated the Board with plans for a shared booth at the Tulsa Boat, Sport and Travel Show next year, stating that a call for volunteers to help man the booth will ring out sometime next January. Steve also stated that he would like to see WSC host some national event each year, suggesting something as the US Masters or Women's North American Championship. Steve will look into the national Sunfish events and report back to the Board. Steve noted that the Sand Springs Community Center would be moving into a new facility soon and asked the Board to consider a

donation in appreciation of our use of their center. Terry was in agreement and will address this on a future Agenda.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Tina made an apology to the BOG and to the Editor of the Windword concerning her tardiness of transcribed Minutes and affirmed that they would be ready for future same-month Windword inclusion. J Copies of the March 2008 minutes were then handed out. After minor change, Steve made a motion they be approved as corrected; Earl seconded; the minutes were approved. The 2008 burgee stickers and membership cards have been ordered from the printer.

FACILITIES MANAGER'S REPORT:

Steve made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Reports as stated; Jo Ann seconded; reports were approved.

ACTIVITIES CAPTAIN'S REPORT: Tucky has been in contact with A&B Engraving for clothing and novelty items. Keeping minimum order restrictions in mind, she is compiling a list of items that might be offered for sale to our membership, with water bottles at the top of her list. Plans for the 2008 Christmas party are underway. Chili Cookoff is Saturday, April 19th with cooking beginning at 9:00am and judging at 12:30pm. Remember cooks: NO BEANS.

She will put the list on the website and hopes members will check it to make sure they are not in arrears. A link for the lake level hourly readings has been added to the website. Keystone is currently at 723; the Pavilion floor lies underwater at 740. It is anticipated that the 2008 Directories will be ready shortly after the Work Party.

REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT: Steve entertained the BOG with his Operation Opti tale: the acquisition of the ten Optis and trailer from Minnesota's Upper Minnetonka Yacht Club. He and Skeeter made a quick weekend trip up to Spring Park, returning late Sunday via the Bridges of Madison County lowa with nine Optis on the trailer and the tenth as cargo inside the Suburban. Steve reports they as well as the trailer are in very good shape and little needs to be done to ready them for summer's sailing. Mathias Laugesen will be our GUST instructor bringing 10 years coaching experience in Europe. Swim tests will be scheduled soon. Keep in mind that a swim test is mandatory prior to participation in any Training Camp and registration for the three camps opens on the 19th at the Chili Cookoff. Darline will add a form on the website for Associate memberships so that non members wishing to participate in the sailing camps may be approved for membership PRIOR to the swim tests and training camps. VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT: The annual Work Party is Saturday, May 3rd. Jo Ann will be reviewing the projects with Jack prior to the Chili Cookoff. PAST COMMODORE'S REPORT: Ray is preparing for the May 17th & 18th 2008 Bob Hobock/Rod Tillotson Memorial CSSA Spring Open Regatta. Gil Greenwood is PRO and Ray will get with him concerning the sailing instructions that will be handed out at registration. It is estimated that there might be close to 40 boats registering for the Regatta. Jo Ann mentioned that Windycrest has a favorable reputation for holding good regattas.

COMMODORE'S REPORT: Terry is very concerned over the vandalism issue. He stressed that the membership needs to take responsibility for their club; they are the eyes and ears and should be active in vigilance, reporting any suspicious activity to the BOG and/or the Facilities Manager. He thanked the Vandalism Committee for their good and thoughtful input

and hopes they also address the need for strength behind our rules.

Well it appears that we will be dealing with high water again for a while . . . The Corp of Engineers indicated that the high water may be as bad as last year. We get frustrated when the lake rises, but flood control is the reason the lake was built. If we are going to use it for recreation, we have to be understanding when the lake is doing what it was designed for. Let's try to make the best of a bad situation.

Make sure that you keep your dock lines and mooring lines in good condition and adjusted properly. It is not the clubs responsibility to make sure that your boat is secure.

The high water may affect the racing again this year but the racing season has kicked off with very good participation. I am sure that those that have done race committee on the "convertible RC boat" will appreciate the new one with the top. The new committee boat will be FANTASTIC! I can't wait to see it on the water!

As you all are aware, we have had more vandalism at the club. We asked for volunteers to be on a committee to address the vandalism problem and several members stepped forward and were willing to review the information and make some recommendations.

One of the recommendations by the vandalism committee was the new club rule that was adopted by the BOG. I have had a few conversations with members that did not think that the rule was in support of our youth. My response was that I don't see that the new rule will be a problem if the parents are aware of their children's whereabouts. If our youth are as responsible as we think, I believe that they will understand the necessity of the rule. They too, can't be happy about the problems that we are having and it is a shame that a few rotten apples spoil the barrel. This new rule will not affect very many. All that the rule asks is for the parents to give permission for their kids to be at the lake after the designated time and to let a BOG member, or Jack, know. It may cause a few that like to come out to the club late at night and drink (while under age) to go elsewhere. We will not tolerate under-age drinking at the club.

Each instance of vandalism has been discovered after a member saw youth at the club the night before. We have to start somewhere and all vandalism or thefts will be reported to the Osage County Sheriff's Department.

Please support your fleets by attending fleet meetings. There is not a better way to meet fellow members and enjoy GOOD food.

Again, we have a GREAT club and GREAT members! Thank you for all that you do for Windycrest and I will see you at the lake, high water or not!

Work party - 9:00 a.m. Saturday May 3, 2008



- A rope used for a function on a boat, such as a sheet, halyard, cunningham or painter
- 9. Describes a boat sailing as close to the wind as possible (2 words)

- The lower back corner of a mainsail or jib
- 14. The small triangular sail in front of the mast
- 16. The back edge of a sail where the battens are located



<u>Classes:</u> All boats welcome. Four boats in the same class make a fleet. All others sail in an appropriate handicap fleet.

Rules: The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008 as adopted and amended by US SAILING, CSSA Sailing Instructions and the local appendix will govern races. All boats shall conform to class rules.

<u>Safety:</u> Standard safety equipment required including throwables and signaling device (16ft+boats). Lake patrol requires skippers to carry photo ID.

Scoring: Low point system: 1 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, 3 for 3rd, etc.

Boats must have a sail number to be scored.

<u>Handicapping:</u> Current US SAILING Portsmouth System. Skippers should verify that a US SAILING Portsmouth D-PN number has been established for their boat.

<u>Trophies:</u> 4 boats in a fleet = 1 trophy; 8 boats = 2 trophies; 12 boats = 3 trophies; 16 boats = 4 trophies. Plus special awards.

<u>Housing:</u> Free camping at Club with bathhouse. Some RV space available. Hotels in Sand Springs.

<u>Facilities:</u> Open pavilion, modern bathhouse, 3-boat wide ramp, ample parking, mast-raising device, water storage for keelboats, tie-up dock, board boat dock. Convenience store one mile from the club.

Food & Drink: Free continental breakfast Saturday & Sunday morning. Free refreshments after race. Buy Saturday dinner.

Entry Fees and Costs: \$22.00 per boat; \$5.00 for crew. \$10.00 CSSA annual membership required for skippers. Junior sailors (17 and under) sail for free. \$2.00 discount for US SAILING members; must show card. Saturday dinners are \$8.00 each and can be purchased at registration.
