ance. Tom said we're in good shape, but not great shape; the main expense for the year was the breakwater repair. Libbye, Ken, Rex and Allene have been talking and working together to add some zip to Oktoberfest. They spoke to Richard Bunn & IV McNamara and the Santana Fleet will be happily passing the event to the Cruisers Fleet. This being the Annual Meeting, all agree that it should be the best attended of all social events at the Club and plans for outdoor cooking, music and antics are in the making. Libbye's proposed ideas were supported unanimously by the BOG.

Fleet Captain's Report: Stephen said due to lack of interest, the rest of the night races are cancelled and this coming Wednesday is the last Wednesday series race. Darline asked about the turn out this year and Stephen said it was mediocre, but he has lots of feedback and will pass it along to the next Fleet Captain. Stephen will look into another Beach Party or other social, perhaps a Moonlight Madness of sorts.

Commodore's Report: Jo Ann had nothing else to say other than to thank the BOG for a good job this year. Darline asked about the new slate of Governors; Allene said they will publish it in the September Windword; voting will take place at the Annual Meeting in October.

New business: Tom wants to put together a committee address members on what to do with the club; to get some information on membership dynamics and what kind of race schedule is wanted. Stephen suggested attaching a questionnaire to the Annual Meeting ballot. David suggested it also be a downloadable file on the website. Allene said it could be advertised with the Oktoberfest activities. Stephen mentioned that he was going to do a survey for just the racing people and offered to be in charge of this survey. Rex brought up the lack of strong fleets, stressing that they are the where the social events evolve and what make the club fun. Jo Ann said it takes dynamic leadership to keep them going and that members who have always been orchestrating events and activities have just worn out. Jack had an idea that instead of assigning just one fleet to an event, that perhaps we have every fleet be in charge of one portion of each event. He suggests that including each fleet at each event, it will increase participation and foster inclusion and comradery for the newer members. Jo Ann said that Ninnescah had the different docks responsible for everything. She also said they had a progressive dinner where each dock was responsible for a portion/course of the dinner. Allene said a progressive dinner would be great fun and will put it on the calendar for next year.

The next Board of Governors meeting will be held September 14th (note that this is the second Monday in the month rather than the usual first Monday) at 6:30pm in the Case Community Center, 1050 W Wekiwa Road, Sand Springs.

Meeting adjourned at 8:13 pm.


