## VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

As I promised I made the motion to not allow associate members to go on the slip list and we deferred it until the October meeting. It was met with a spirited but respectful debate. I admire those that want to use the allowance as an incentive for new associate members to look forward to upgrading their memberships but I still believe that the privileges of the club should go to regular members that are fully invested.

I made a motion that we document the need for Robert's Rules of Order into our bylaws for running our meetings. I have served on boards before and found it a very useful tool to keep meetings moving and make sure we don't get bogged down. No pun intended.

I also made a motion to add the duties of membership under the Vice Commodore's duties in the bylaws so it is formalized.
