Working On The Chain Gang

What secures our docks to the bottom of the lake? The short answer is a ½" chain and Danforth anchor system devised some thirty years ago. Since some of these chains started failing in 2010, the club moved to replace each chain, using club volunteers to maintain dock security and our investment. When enough chains failed to make C-Dock ineffective immediate action was required.

Replacing the Windycrest C-Dock chains has been a three-year effort. The first season the chain gang replaced seven of the most critical chains. The second year twelve chains were replaced and this year eight were replaced finishing up the total of twenty-seven (27) chains that secure C-Dock. Most of these chains were thirty years old and showing their age.

Each securing chain is approximately 150 feet in length and includes a cement weight (called a sinker), which is located about 50 feet from the dock connection. The remaining 100 feet of chain connects the sinker to an anchor. C-Dock requires over 4,000 feet of chain.

Each anchor weighs 475 lbs; each sinker 500 lbs. and each length of chain 375 lbs, so each chain combination weighs a total of 1,350 lbs. That's a total weight, of the complete C-Dock system, of 36,450 lbs. Jack arbitrarily adds a couple hundred lbs. per chain to compensate for the mud and or zebra muscles stuck to the old chains.

The Process

Finding the anchors, connecting and disconnecting the chains in the total darkness and muddy depths of the cove is anything but easy and or clean. Some of the anchors are buried several feet under the silt and mud. The club is lucky to have a very qualified member who was willing and able to perform the first necessary underwater process.

Yul Schafer would often dive three (3) times a week; he would dig to locate the anchor and disconnect the old 50 ft chain connection; a zip line was then rigged from a boat, or the dock and the new chain is moved down to the anchor. He would then dive again and connect the new chain to the anchor and tie a line and buoy system to both the new and old chain (imagine doing that in the dark). You've no doubt seen these small red buoys around the dock area from time to time.

The rest of the chain gang (usually three of four people each day) would then be set up to pull the old chain out of the water and replace it with a new one. Pulling an old chain off the bottom is another particularly dirty and strenuous job and usually they accomplished one chain per day. Laying the new chain is somewhat cleaner, but almost as strenuous, and usually takes a day per chain as well (occasionally they managed two). Remember that the chains must weave over and under each other in a very specific order, so the dock can properly rise and fall with the lake level.

I am proud to report that C-Dock and the northern breakwater anchor systems have been restored and parts of D-Dock are planned for next spring. Over the years many Windycrest members have given their time and energy to maintain and build club properties. This is just one more example of volunteers stepping up for the club we all enjoy.

My hope is that it will continue to gain traction in the coming years.

This year we repaved our road. That was an easy decision. If you leave a road like ours unattended for too long, you can end up with major expenses. Why not keep it maintained and let every member enjoy it. The road also makes a favorable impression for our friends and guests visiting our Club.

We also have scheduled a replacement for the old board boat dock. As one of the oldest structures at the Club, it had become un-repairable. The new dock to replace it should be in place by spring 2014, and with luck, by the end of 2013. Thanks to the work done at the work parties, our docks structures are in relatively good shape. With the facilities manager doing many of the tasks around the Club, at work party the membership gets to attack the maintience jobs that become much easier when many people can help pull them off. 
I would like to comment on the group that is saving the Club thousands of dollars. The "chain gang" has been quietly working on the anchors on the docks for the last three years. This group, which has about a dozen core members, has gone above and beyond all expectations. Hopefully all the chains on C dock will be in place by the end of the year. The plan is to begin work on D dock next year. The group works at their own pace and schedule, but don't think they don't ever get anything done. It can be long, slow, tedious, hard work. Lots of planning and prep goes into what they do. Over the course of time they have become real experts at the job. Though there are perks to the job, the time, energy, and effort that they give to the Club is a reflection of the love that they have for Windycrest. For that, on behalf of the entire Club, I sincerely thank all of the chain gang for what you do for Windycrest.

Looking into the future, I only see one immediate need to address. We have had some power boat issues in the last half of this season, so perhaps it is time to address upgrading our chase boats. They've lived long and exciting lives for a boat being at Windycrest. Perhaps this winter we can put together a committee to look at the exact direction to take on this matter. Long term, I do not see any pressing problems. You can always use a little more rip-rap or concrete here or there. But those are just maintence issues. Until a big capital expenditure or a nasty storm comes along we should be in good shape.

I'd like to compliment the USACE of the management of the lake over the last 6 or 8 years. I feel like they have done a great job managing the lake level. It doesn't mean we will never flood again, but I think they work a lot harder than they used to on keeping the water levels as normal as possible for their property lessees. That in turn takes a lot of stress off our in and near the water assets and makes the lake more enjoyable for longer periods.

Overall, the Club is in great shape. Our founders set up a great charter for us to follow. It has worked wonderfully for nearly 50 years. I've travelled around a lot and have experienced many nice sailing clubs, and I can tell you that Windycrest can stand with the best of them. We should all be proud of Windycrest.

Proposed By-Law Changes

Due to errors in the announced by-law changes in the September Windword, the BOG is re-submitting the proposed changes. **The changes are in bold print**. The BOG will act on these proposals at the November BOG meeting.

#1.

Article VII, Section 3. The Vice Commodore shall assume the office and title of Commodore in the case of vacancy from any cause in that office, and shall assume the duties of Commodore in case of the temporary absence or disability of the latter. The Vice Commodore shall be in charge of buildings, grounds, and docks. They shall be the Membership Chairman.

Article IX, Sec. 3.

All meetings shall be conducted per Robert's Rules of Order.


