<u>Call meeting to order:</u> BOG members present tonight were: Terry Rainey (Commodore), Marcus Fairless (Rear Commodore), Sally Daniel (Secretary), Tom Proctor (Treasurer), Lisa Weatherholt, (Fleet Captain), Matt Gillis (Activities Captains), Danny Ziegler (Past Commodore) and Jack Stewart (Facilities Manager)

<u>Introduction of the Guests</u>: Steve Gregg. Steve will be rejoining as a regular keelboat member. He was a member of Windycrest back in the early 1990's. We want to welcome him and his family back to Windycrest.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Sally asked for any corrections or additions to the last month's minutes. The motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the minutes as presented. Sally reported that the directory will go to print at the end of this week. New directories will be available at the work party on May 3rd.

Windword editor: Articles are due on April 12th, 2014.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Tom distributed the monthly report. It was reviewed and accepted. Tom then discussed the status of dues collection. One member was removed from the roles for non-payment of dues.

<u>Facilities Manager Report:</u> Jack repaired the club's Hydrohoist this winter and it is back in the water and useable. Water on the docks has been turned on. The Ski Barge's motor is still in the shop. A Honda outboard technician will address the low rev problem with the motor in the near future. The breakwater has been re-anchored but still requires one added anchor that will be added this month. Jack then commented that the new SeaArk boat is in service and the motor is in its break-in period. The acquisition of the boat went smoothly and it is performing well.

<u>Activities Captain's Report:</u> The Annual Chili Cook-off will be April 12th. The information about this event will be found on the website. Matt is encouraging all WSC families to come and enjoy the festivities.

<u>Fleet Captain's Report:</u> Lisa reported that Windycrest had their first race for the season this past Sunday (April 3rd). There were 8 boats that participated in the race. Lisa also reported that there will be two minor adjustments to the sailing instructions that will be published in the new directory.

<u>Rear Commodore's Report:</u> Marcus discussed the Junior Training program and stated that Michael Gent, the new Training Director, will take the US Sailing instructors course now being offered, along will also be taking a CPR refresher course. The Annual Swimming Test will be at the Salvation Army building, 4403 S. 129th West Avenue in Prattville(Sand Springs) on April 26th from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. Marcus is also working to develop an Adult's Training program for this summer. Dates and times have not been defined yet.

There was a motion and a 2nd that these amendments be adopted. After a brief discussion the motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm. The next meeting will be on May 5^{th} , 2014 6:30 pm at the Case Community Center.

Rear Commodore's Report

Spring Time is a great time to take your boat out for a long overdue sail, but be careful! A lot can happen to your sailboat sitting on a hydro hoist, floating in a slip or even covered on the trailer in dry storage. I encourage all our members to do an inspection on the standing rigging, lines and tiller components. Taking a good look at your hydro hoist, before dropping the boat in the water can save you a long unexpected workday. I can speak from experience finding out that something has happened over the winter halfway across the lake. I have had my catamaran head stay rip out of the hull and drop my mast in the water. I have had my water ballast intake hatch grow shut with algae. This resulted in my 26' hunter tipping on its side with the keel dangling in the air, after I just told my father- in- law that the boat can't possibly tip over. The tiller has broken off in my hand as the duck tap gave way from the winter sun damage. I have even gone to sleep in my boat cabin only to find a family of bats waking up for the night's flight time. These are only a few of things that come to mind. Don't let history repeat its self. Learn from my mistakes. Hope everyone has a happy Easter, may the bunny find your door.

FLEET CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It's April and club racing has begun!

On the first Sunday of this month, Keelboat Spring 1 & 2 were sailed. I was the PRO; as always, early April weather is interesting. This time the wind was from the east—which was a strange direction for setting a course. It was cool and cloudy, temp in the low 50s. We set our first race course outside the cove, but going back and forth across the lake just wasn't a long enough course. So we pulled everything and moved to the north, where there is ample room for a course set east and west. 30-40° oscillations were typical, but right after the 2nd start, I looked forward from the RC boat and saw the causeway; the wind was blowing due south! That made our view more interesting for a couple of minutes while the racers dealt with the wind shift. Unusual for April, the breeze was around 7 mph with puffs 10-12.



We had a couple of new boats out there—one new keelboat and a new Windycrest motorboat. The keelboat is a J70, very sleek and lovely—and fast! The new SEA ARK motorboat has been mentioned before, but on this day it was put to work. We took it out to check the wind conditions, and Dave Dolcater drove it during the races. He is quite pleased with its performance. We all have high expectations for it.

CHANGES TO Windycrest Sailing Instructions

These will be published in the 2014 directory-

10. The Start

Current:

10. 5 will be DELETED

(No race shall be started if the wind is consistently less than 4 mph. . . et cetera)

Reasons: First, we have regularly ignored this requirement, and second, there is a **time limit** that is addressed in **section 17**. As always, it is up to each skipper to decide to race, and the PRO must always use his/her best judgment in conducting the races.

19. Scoring

New:

19.2

Discarded races will be allowed on the following basis for each series.

If 7-8 races are sailed, 2 discards are allowed.

If 5-6 races are sailed, 1 discard is allowed.

If 4 or fewer races are sailed, no discards will be allowed for the series.

20. Regatta and Race Committee Credits

20.2

Race Committee credit (RC) or regatta credit (RG) will be allowed for one race day per series.

Reason: The new series scoring allows 1 less throwout than previous instructions. The RC or regatta credit is now one per series instead of two. Fewer WSC sailors are traveling to other regattas, which is a reason to request credits or to miss other racing days. This reflects our current habits more accurately.

Standard STARTING SEQUENCE, Explained

Flag	Sound	Time until Start	Signal	Action taken
- none -	Multiple short beeps	Approx 6 min.	Courtesy	Optional signal to inform racers that sequence will begin soon

AP (Answering Pennant) = Postpone



If the Race Committee (RC) needs to stop the Starting sequence, the AP flag is raised with 2 **I** sound signals. **It can be used** *prior* **to the actual Start signal.** This gives the RC time to make necessary changes to the course or starting line, or to stop a sequence when an error is made. When it is taken down with one **I** sound signal, there is 1 minute until the Warning (5-min.) signal.

Explanation of class flags:

For Windycrest club racing, we use numeral pennants. (One for 1st start, Two for 2nd start, etc.) Flags that represent a sailboat's class (e.g., Sunfish, Thistle, MC Scow) are often used during regattas. They will be described in the Sailing Instructions for that race or regatta.

While at the Chili-Cook-off, which was awesome by the way, I got into a discussion with a couple of long time members about maybe creating some type of foundation through Windycrest. Now I'm not going to pretend to know much about this, but I think that if a person or person's estate would like to donate money to the Club, it cannot be done tax free. If a 501-C (3) foundation were to be created, a tax free donation would be allowed. There are costs, taxes, and maintenance involved annually for a foundation, not to mention having its own directors. I do not know all the ramifications for the Club, or how it could affect our current operations.

SCORING: Low point system. 1pt for 1st, 2pt for 2nd, etc. One throw out allowed if 7 or more races sailed.

TROPHIES: The Hobock-Tillotson Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat of the fleet that is selected as "The most competitive in the regatta." The selection will be made by the PRO and other race committee members. Two trophies will be awarded per fleet. FACILITIES: Lakeside open air pavilion, modern bathhouse, three wide boat ramp, in the water tie-up space, ample parking.
