Call Meeting to order and the following BOG members were present: Terry Rainey- Commodore, Darrel Daniel- Vice Commodore, Marcus Fairless- Rear Commodore, Sally Daniel- Secretary, Tom Proctor- Treasurer, Lisa Weatherholt- Fleet Captain, Matt Gillis- Activities Captain, and Danny Ziegler- Past Commodore.

Introduction of guests: Michael Palmer and Jack Stewart- Facilities Manager.

Approval of minutes of the last meeting motioned by Lisa and seconded by Matt. Sally announced that the new directories were passed out at the Annual Work Party.

<u>Treasurer report:</u> Tom passed out the monthly financial statement. There were a few extra expenses this past month but nothing out of the ordinary.

<u>Vice Commodore report:</u> Darrel was well pleased with all the work that was done at the Work Party. There is still a lot of moving around the docks. Also Darrel will be getting in touch with the members that did not attend the Work Party, to make arrangements for a make-up work day. This make up work must be completed by July1st.

A CSSA Affiliated Regatta—Open to all Sailing Classes

MAY 17-18, 2014

RULES: Races will be governed by 2013-16 ISAF Rules of Racing Sailing as amended by US Sailing and Regatta Sailing Instructions.

SAFETY: Standard safety equipment as required by state law and class rules.

ENTRY FEE: There is no fee to sail in the regatta.

REGATTA REGISTRATION: Registration required to be scored in this event. Registering includes free continental breakfasts and free drinks and snacks after races. Pre-registration required for Saturday night dinner.

SATURDAY NIGHT COOK YOUR OWN DINNER-\$14.00 PER PERSON

Open to all regatta participants and Windycrest members. Menu includes ribeye steak or chicken breast, baked potato, salad, dinner rolls, ice tea, and cookies for dessert. This dinner REQUIRES A RESERVATION by May 14th.

SCORING: Low point system. 1pt for 1st, 2pt for 2nd, etc. One throw out allowed if 7 or more races sailed.

COURSES: Regular and alternative courses will be utilized to maximize the number, length, and enjoyment of races for all participants.

TROPHIES: The Hobock-Tillotson Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat of the fleet that is selected as "The most competitive in the regatta." The selection will be made by the PRO and other race committee members. Two trophies will be awarded per fleet. FACILITIES: Lakeside open air pavilion, modern bathhouse, three wide boat ramp, in the water tie-up space, ample parking.

HOUSING: Camping (primitive) and limited RV sites available at WSC. Hotels in Sand Springs (14miles) include the Hampton Inn and Best Western Hotel.

DIRECTIONS: From downtown Tulsa, use US Hwy 412 west to 209th W. Ave. Go north on 209th W. Ave 4.6 mi. to Windycrest Road. Turn left and travel 1 mile to Windycrest. Guests from the southwest should be aware that Hwy 151 over Keystone dam is closed.
