## Commodore's Report September 2014

My year as your commodore is quickly winding down and there continues to be much to attend to as we approach the fall. The Catalina 25 / 27 fleet did their normal awesome job on the Labor Day brunch as we signaled the approaching end of summer. The weather was great and the wind was howling for the long distance race with lots of boats on the starting line for this long standing tradition for Windycrest.

Our hard working "Chain Gang" has continued their work through the summer on "D" dock with 6 anchor chains replaced, with a plan to replace two more yet this year. Next year we plan to finish "D" and have this major project completed for the next decade or so. I cannot emphasize enough, the importance of the replacement of these anchor chains. Had we not been pro-active on this job and replaced these chains when we did, we would probably have had a major failure of the docks by now and I don't even want to think of the impact that this would have on our club. Thanks Jack, for the work that you and your team continue to do for Windycrest.

During August, we had the annual inspection of our premises by the Corps of Engineers. We had a few items to clean up but overall it was a good inspection and we continue to have a positive relationship with the Corps. Another Corps item that has been in the works for many months is the renewal of our lease. Our 20 year lease has expired and we are obligated to have our acreage appraised before the Corps re-sets our new lease rate. The appraisal has recently been completed and we have submitted it to the Corps for their review. We are expecting a significant increase in our lease rate and we will be dealing with that as we approach year end and budget preparation. Stay tuned, we will keep you posted on its impact.

An item that has had significant discussion in our last two board meetings is the presence, use and storage of stand—up paddleboards at the club. These popular boards have been procured by a few members and the club needs to figure out how or if they fit at Windycrest. The board will be dealing with a storage and use policy for these crafts at the next board meeting. If you have an opinion on how or where they should be stored, or if they should be allowed, let a board member know. We would like to hear from you.

Finally, the 35<sup>th</sup> annual charity regatta, Sail for Steve, is now history. We had a rainy day from registration at 9:00 until the boats came off the water at 3:00 and we had a packed house. Before the regatta we had over \$9,000 pledged. The tally after the regatta and lunch was consumed, was over \$11,000. A fantastic performance by you the members of Windycrest in support of our beloved members Steve and Mary Snider and ALS Patient Outreach Services. Thank you Windycrest members; you never cease to amaze me. A detailed report on the regatta is found later in this Windword.

Be sure to plan to attend the annual meeting, election of officers for 2015, and the 17<sup>th</sup> annual Turkey Fry, all combined on October 25<sup>th</sup>.

I look forward to seeing you at the club and on the water soon.

#### **LABOR DAY LONG DISTANCE RACE – 2014**

After everyone fueled up on a once again great brunch, we got right to the racing. The LDLDR is the one that has one big Start and the winners are determined by handicap after the finish. It keeps everyone racing hard to the end. And race hard they did. The race was run in a generally building wind throughout the day. The wind at the start was 10 to 12 mph with good puffs of 18 mph. It slowly built to a solid 15 with gust to 20 by the end of the race. While the wind wasn't over the



top for most of the boats, it was still a long hard slog to beat from the far west end of the lake to the weather mark up by the 412 causeway. There was lots of excitement along the way. Kenny and Amanda capsized a couple of times Harvey blew out a spinnaker. JoAnn got her spinnaker snagged at the top of her mast after the finish, and nearly wound up on the rocks down by Thistle Beach and had to be towed back to the Club. The J-70 lost a couple of crew at one point, keelhauling one of them. Good times had by all!



The first boat to finish ran the course in a little over an hour and a half. The final boat to be scored took 4 hours and 40 minutes. I would guess the course sailed was 18 to 20 miles long. Food for thought: maybe next year we can think about dividing the fleet into two divisions so that the fast boats get a little longer race and the slower boats don't have to be out there all day. All in all it was still a great day to be out on the boat with really excellent weather for the first of September.

# WHO WERE THE WOMEN OF WINDYCREST?

As we approach our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary it's important to remember parts of our journey.

Darline Hobock loved sailboat racing and wanted to see more women participating in the sport. She envisioned a training program taught by women for women. In I981, Darline and Skeeter Chilton, with help from Kathy Morgan and Jacquie McClaskey, founded the "Women of Windycrest, better known as the WOW. Jack Marsee also assisted the women instructors.

The program shifted into high gear when Darlene became the first female Rear Commodore. Now that she was overseeing all of the training programs, WOW took on new life with thirty-three participants. Pat Brown, who taught the beginner's class, joined Darlene and Skeeter. In turn, Dave Dolcater, Jim Esposito, and Charlie Nelson joined Jack. Each Saturday the women would meet at the club pavilion for classes in boat handling, rules, and tactics. Out on the lake, participants learned first hand about the variety of boats they were sailing.



Since the club boats were designated for the juniors the women sailed whatever could be borrowed from club members. This created quite a challenge as each boat had different rigging. The same women seldom used the same boat two Saturdays in a row!

The club soon saw the need for the women to have their own boats and purchased three international 420's. The group was now ready to participate in away regattas.

Their first away regatta was a CSSA Women's Regatta in Norman, Oklahoma and the event was a learning experience for all who attended. The women had never stepped a mast or trailered a boat. All went well and WOW participation in that regatta became an annual event.

The next year Darlene, who was well into her 60's, and Skeeter joined their students on the water. Everyone followed Skeeter around the racecourse tacking and jibing whenever she did.

The Windycrest men soon realized how much fun the women were having and formed their own program. The Sailing Order of Boys (SOB's), which only lasted a couple of years. Both programs were eventually combined into what is now the Sailing Education for Adults (SEA).



It was truly a great time to be a "Woman of Windycrest!"

#### WSC Board Minutes September 8, 2014

Call Meeting to order: Members present were: Terry Rainey (Commodore), Darrel Daniel (Vice Commodore), Marcus Fairless (Rear Commodore), Sally Daniel (Secretary), Tom Proctor (Treasurer), Lisa Weatherholt (Fleet Captain), Matt Gillis (Activities Captain), and Danny Ziegler (Past Commodore)

Introduction of guests: Jack Stewart (Facilities Manager), Julie Stilwell (Windword Editor), Dan Jarrett, Stu Bernd and Richard Ferguson

Dan Jarrett and Stu Bernd wanted the members of Windycrest to be aware of the upcoming Catamaran

Regatta on September 21<sup>st</sup> and September 22<sup>nd</sup> to be hosted by Hobie Fleet 25 and Windycrest. Dan and Stu thanked Windycrest for the use of our facility and the club vessels.

Richard Ferguson, chairman of the Windycrest 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary committee, presented a proposed budget for the celebration, planned for 2015. The board accepted his proposal and encouraged him to present a final budget when the club prepares the annual budget in December.

Approval of minutes of last meeting and secretary comments: There were no changes to the last meeting's minutes and they were approved as presented.

Windword editor comment: Julie asked that the articles be turned on September 13<sup>th</sup>.

#### Treasurer report:

Tom reviewed monthly finance statement: The statement showed that we continue to operate very close to budget, despite the expenses to repair D dock and our on-going anchor chain repairs. Tom then presented a proposal to increase our liability coverage from \$1MM to \$2MM. After discussion, this motion was passed unanimously.





#### **BOG Minutes Cont'd**

#### Vice Commodore report:

D. Daniel reported that there continues to be some movement from dock to dock. He then deferred his report on the dock repairs that are continuing to Jack.

#### Facility Manager report:

J. Stewart reported that there has been 6 of 14 anchor chains on D dock repaired at the present time. Two more will be repaired this year with the balance to be completed next year. He then reported that the Corps of Engineers conducted their annual facility review last month. It went well. He reported that the old breakwater needs work. There was discussion about replacing it next year. This will be discussed at budget time. He also requested that the floats on the D dock ramp be repaired by a commercial dock builder on the lake. A motion was made, 2nded and passed unanimously to move forward with this repair.

#### Activities Captain report:

No report.

<u>Fleet Captain report</u>: Lisa is currently working out the schedule and format for the Windycup, scheduled for October 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### Rear Commodore report:

The Predator has not been sold yet. Marcus will work with Jack to accelerate this action. Marcus will compose an ad on Craig's list.

#### Past Commodore report:

Danny reported that Windycrest has received an appraisal of our property, as requested by the Corps, in preparation for the renewal of our 20 year lease. This will be forwarded to the Corps for their review. He then introduced a stand-up paddleboard resolution that was discussed in depth. Action on this proposal was tabled until next month's meeting.

#### Commodore report:

Terry gave a detailed report on our *Sail for Steve* regatta. The club raised over \$11,000 and Terry expressed his appreciation to all that donated and volunteered to make this a successful event. He then announced BOG nominations. The slate of officers for next year are Past Commodore: Terry Rainey, Commodore: Darrel Daniel, Vice Commodore: Marcus Fairless, Rear Commodore: Matt Gillis, Fleet Captain: Roger Adams, Activities Captain: Harvey and Marcia Baker, Treasurer: Tom Proctor, Secretary: Sally Daniel. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm at the Case Community Center. The next Board of Governor's meeting will be on <u>October 13</u>, 2014 at 6:30 pm at the Case Community Center.

- The Sailing Instructions, and any modifications to the RRS will be available to each skipper at registration. Further changes will be published on the notice board.
- There shall be no appeal of Judge's Decision that could affect a boat's promotion relegation per RRS 70.4(a).
- All boats must comply with the CR914 Class Rules. Boats will be measured, weighed and bow bumpers
  will be required. Entrants shall be registered CR914 owners in good standing of the AMYA and the
  CR914 class.
- The maximum number of entrants will be 23 in the 75MHz band, 6 in the 27M Hz band and open in the 2.4 GHz band.
- It is desirable, but not mandatory, that attendees use 2.4 GHz radios.

<u>Format:</u> Saturday and Sunday races will be conducted and scored in accordance with RRS and Fleet Scoring Solutions as modified by the Sailing Instructions,

Registration: Entries will be accepted, at your earliest convenience, using the online Entry Form accompanied by the \$75 entry fee on a first-come / received basis and you will be notified of your entry acceptance and frequency assignment. Final registration and measurement at The Fly Loft will be Friday October 31st. 1:00 – 4:00 pm (late registration on Saturday November 1st, 9:00 AM at Carol Williams Pond). Entries submitted after October 15th will be subject to a \$50 late fee. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE AT
