

# Past Commodore's Report Cont'd

One of my projects has been the renewal of the USACE lease. We have not received the new lease but expect to have it in hand for 2015. It has been a slow process to put all the information together. The Corps have been great about it and Windycrest is happy to work together with them as a partner. While on the subject of the Corps, I think they have done a terrific job managing our water levels at Keystone. I feel that over the last 8 to 10 years they have really worked hard to keep the lake levels as normal as possible. While we have had less rain the last 3 years, I've notice that when we do have high water events they don't last nearly as long or seem as extreme as they used to back in the 1900's. Sure, it still floods. That's the real reason for the lake. But as more partners improve infrastructure around the lake, the Corps work hard to lessen the impact of high (and low) water for all of us. For that, we should be very appreciative to the Corps.

One thing that hasn't taken hold as I envisioned was the Docks and Lots idea to help offset the loss of some of our fleets. The general idea was to include more members who fell outside of the traditional fleets. There were a few unseen bugs. While it didn't take hold like I hoped, perhaps it is an idea whose time just hasn't come. That's OK, Windycrest always keeps trying new ideas.

In 2015 Windycrest will be celebrating our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We should celebrate. The vision of our founding members is still in place. We have a great group on the BOG moving into 2015, and they will continue to carry on our vision of the Club. Our Windycrest Spirit- *a friendly, helpful, can do attitude*— abounds with older members as well as brand new members. It's what has made Windycrest what it is today. # **WSC Board Minutes** October 13, 2014

Call Meeting to order: Members present were: Terry Rainey (Commodore), Sally Daniel (Secretary), Tom Proctor (Treasurer), Lisa Weatherholt (Fleet Captain), Danny Ziegler (Past Commodore) and Jack Stewart (Facilities Manager) Members absent were: Darrel Daniel (Vice Commodore), Marcus Fairless (Rear Commodore) and Matt Gillis (Activities Captain).

Introduction of guests: Dan Jarrett, Stu Bernd, Charlie Keithline and Mary Snider

Dan Jarrett and Stu Bernd thanked Windycrest for the use of our facility and the club vessels to run their regatta on September 20th and 21<sup>st</sup>. They reported that the regatta was successful with over 20 boats participating. They then presented the club a very attractive trophy of thanks and appreciation.

Charlie Keithline then addressed the board and presented them with a defibrillator for the club if we wanted it. He stated that he will have a secure cabinet made for it and the board suggested that it be mounted on the wall in the pavilion. He also presented us with three fully equipped first aid kits. These will be deployed in the restrooms and in the pavilion. The board thanked Charlie for these generous donations.

Mary Snider then addressed the board and thanked the club for running the Sail for Steve regatta. She stated that this regatta, funded totally by Windycrest members is having a strong positive impact on Steve and the other area sufferers of ALS.

There was a motion to approve last month's meeting minutes. It was approved without discussion.

### Treasurer report:

Tom reviewed monthly finance statement: The statement showed that we continue to operate very close to budget. Tom then presented preliminary budget information to the board members to consider for budget preparation at next month's meeting.

### Facility Manager report:

J. Stewart reported that all deficiencies from the Corps of Engineers inspection have or are being addressed. He also reported that the anchor replacement work on "D" dock is finished for the year. Six anchor chains remain to be replaced next year. Jack and the board also discussed the possible replacement of the north breakwater. It is deteriorating and will need to be replaced in the future. Jack also reported that we have sold the Predator. The new owner will take position of the boat within the week.

### **BOG Minutes Cont'd**

<u>Fleet Captain report</u>: Lisa discussed the approaching Windycup club championship, scheduled for October 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. We discussed the possible conflict of the Turkey Fry and annual meeting on the 25<sup>th</sup> and after discussion, it was decided to move the start time of the regatta up 1 hour to assure that the competitors would be able to attend the dinner and meeting.

### Past Commodore report:

Danny reported that he has had contact with the Corps of Engineers concerning our lease renewal but has had no indication of the status of the new lease nor the new rental agreement. We then discussed the ownership of paddleboards at the club. No action was taken.

### Commodore report:

Terry gave a final tally on the Sail for Steve report and thanked Danny and Lisa for their services on the board. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15.

# Remembering October at Windycrest!

In a way October is somewhat of a depressing month at Windycrest. It signals the winding down of the racing season and the beginning of winter. However, the leaves are turning and the colors are usually spectacular if one has time to enjoy them and time mind the tiller at the same while concentrating on their racing prowess. There is one particular October event that was a Windycrest tradition for almost 30 years.



Oktoberfest is a sixteen-day festival that's held in Munich, Germany from late September to early October. In the early 1980's Windycrest members decided to recreate their own Oktoberfest.

Successful events at Windycrest usually require a group of people to organize and host the activities associated with each aspect of any official event; Oktoberfest at Windycrest was no exception to that rule.


The Centerboard Handicap and Coronado Fleets were initially chosen as the host fleets, followed by the Keelboat Handicap and Cruising Fleets until 1990. The Catalina 22 Fleet hosted the event for the next thirteen years and in 2003 the Santana 20 Fleet took on the responsibility for the next eight years. Members celebrated their last Oktoberfest in 2011 and will retain wonderful memories of moonlit nights, German music, dark beer and of course the dancing!





Each host family prepared their favorite authentic German dish such as sausages, red cabbage, grilled fish, German potato salad and dumplings. You could always count on the traditional Bavarian Black Forest Cake for dessert!

Dark German beer was the drink of choice for the evening. German music was playing in the background; the fire was usually crackling in the fireplace as some members arrived in costume at the pavilion. Early activities included sack races for the young and old alike while the traditional Chicken Dance was always a favorite. If you had a German Alpine hat, you wore it; if you had a beer stein, you filled it to the brim and would proudly show it off.

# 2014 Tulsa Catfight

Hobie Fleet 25 and Windycrest Sailing Club held a fantastic catamaran regatta on beautiful Lake Keystone on September 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. The regatta hosted Hobie 16, 17, 18, and 20 classes and an open handicap catamaran class. Participating teams travelled from Texas, Kansas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and even as far away as Minnesota to race.

This year we were in a new location on Lake Keystone at Washington Irving South Park and Campground. The campground is spacious and clean with nice facilities and many RV and tent camp sites available. Launching and set up was extremely easy and convenient from the beautiful wide sandy beach right in front of the race course. After registration and Skippers Meeting at Windycrest, we all convened on the water for an 11am start. Late September is a wonderful time to be on the water in Northeastern Oklahoma and racing conditions were perfect on Saturday.

The first race was classic light and shifty conditions making for many lead changes as boats took advantage or fell victim to the shifts in direction and velocity. After a shortened course first race of three laps and diminishing winds, we were all prepared for dying wind over the rest of the day. Instead, the wind freshened up to 10-12 and built as the day went on. After the third race, the Hobie 20 and Handicap fleets were ready to go again while the other fleets were still rounding the weather mark. Our efficient RC under PRO Ron Knak's direction got us off the line before the next fleets arrived for a downwind finish, and the fourth race of the day was the best as we had good wind in the sprint W-L-W-downwind finish race.

For dinner, we all took a short boat ride from Washington Irving across the lake to Windycrest for a great grill-out of hamburgers, hotdogs, and all the trimmings. Cold brew was enjoyed courtesy of Windycrest's keg-erator as we watched the sun set across the lake and talked about the day's races. A good time was had by all, and the return boat ride across the lake was a fun way to end the day.

Sunday is the day to make up for that bad race you had on Saturday and move up the score sheet, or sometimes it's the day that you fall back in the pack after a brilliant day one of racing. With mid day storms and rain in the forecast, wewere all anxious to get off at least one good race before the weather. With that in mind, race one on Sunday was another sprint W-L-W-downwind finish. Overnight, a cold front had begun to move in and the wind did a 180 to the north. With the front approaching, wind picked up to solid double trap de-power conditions for all boats and made for an exciting fast sprint race. After the first race on Sunday, the wind continued to build, and many (but not all) boats high-tailed it to the beach before the storm rolled in. Our valiant race committee ran a final race on Sunday for those brave souls willing to race in high wind and driving rain.

Many thanks to our race committee: PRO team Ron Knak and Kathy Knak, and Windycrest committee and chase boat volunteers Steve Elliot, Harvey Baker, Libbye Brooks, John Kerr, Danny Ziegler, and Roger Adams. Thanks to Kenny McIntosh for the beautiful hand-carved trophies. Once again Kenny outdid himself and created a one-of-a-kind memento of a great regatta that brought many oohs and ahhs from the crowd. Thanks to Mike and Laurie Montgomery for catering a delicious dinner, and also to WindycrestSailing Club for their support, help, and club pavilion for Saturday dinner and meetings. From all accounts this was a fun and successful regatta; everyone in attendance expressed theirhappiness with the site, the race course, campground, food, weather, and the beautiful location.
