## Commodore's Report:



RULES: Races will be governed by 2013-16 ISAF Rules of Racing Sailing as amended by US Sailing and Regatta Sailing Instructions.

SAFETY: Standard safety equipment as required by state law and class rules.

**ENTRY FEE**: There is no fee to sail in the regatta.

**REGATTA REGISTRATION**: Registration required to be scored in this event. Registering includes free continental breakfasts and free drinks and snacks after races. Pre-registration required for Saturday night dinner.

SATURDAY NIGHT COOK YOUR OWN DINNER—\$15.00 PER **PERSON** Open to all regatta participants and Windycrest members. Menu includes rib eye steak or chicken breast, baked potato, salad, dinner rolls, ice tea, and cookies for dessert. This dinner REQUIRES A RESERVATION by May 13th. Go to www.windycrest.com and make yours on-line.

SCORING: Low point system. 1pt for 1st, 2pt for 2nd, etc. One throw out allowed if five (5) or more races are sailed.

**COURSES**: Regular and alternative courses will be utilized to maximize the number, length, and enjoyment of races for all participants.

**TROPHIES**: The Hobock-Tillotson Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat of the fleet that is selected as "The most competitive in the regatta." The selection will be made by the PRO and other race committee members. Two trophies will be awarded per fleet.

**FACILITIES**: Lakeside open air pavilion, modern bathhouse, three wide boat ramp, in the water tie-up space, ample parking.

**HOUSING**: Camping (primitive) and limited RV sites available at WSC. Hotels in Sand Springs (14miles) include the Hampton Inn and Best Western Hotel.

**DIRECTIONS**: From downtown Tulsa, use US Hwy 412 west to 209th W. Ave. Go north on 209th W. Ave 4.6 mi. to Windycrest Road. Turn left and travel 1 mile to Windycrest. Guests from the southwest should be aware that Hwy 151 over Keystone dam is closed.
