
#### Past Commodore report:

I can't remember exactly why, but I am guessing that it was big wind. We were only able to have one race day (2 races) in our Spring Series. As a fleet we did not race between April 26th and June 28th. The high water also effected the Wednesday Series. The MC's only raced on 2 of the scheduled 11 race days. Things got back to normal in mid July and we were able to have nice summer and fall series. The Rib Fest that the MC's hosted on the Fourth of July was a huge success. Greg, Tiffany and Drew Ziegler still get thanks for that event. Our MCSW Regatta was a big success with 26 boats racing, and 12 of those were outside of the Club. That was the most participation we've had in quite a while.
