The drawing will be September 10, 2016 just before the Skippers Meeting at the 10:30 AM.


The first drawing is for Paul to crew in the Sail for Steve Charity Regatta, September 10, 2016.

It has been a huge success and like I said for the juniors still plenty of great sailing days left. I have talked about having a few more advanced/racing classes, please email me if interested.

Notes and Observations: Many folks want to get into sailing but don't know the first step, do I buy a boat and go learn on my own or take sailing lessons with out a boat? Both would be the best bet.

What kind of a boat do I buy? Most of the time, depending on the person who convinces you to buy a boat is probably going to recommend a boat that they have sailed or own. I personally would convince everyone to buy a MC or C scow. But depending on your budget, intentions of racing and family size there is a wide variety of options. New Boats are only to be bought if there is not a healthy market of used boats and an abundance of used boats is usually a reflection of the interest in the class. A good used boat you want to make sure it has decent covers, trailers/hydrohoist, lines, safety gear, water tight, working engine, decent sails. Many small factors that can add up to thousands. A smaller boat is going to teach you to sail in less time, larger boats are less sensitive to wind, steering and body weight. Therefore a smaller boat will give you a literal crash course in physics. I have endless rambling knowledge along with most Windycresters, but check as many sources you can before pulling a trigger on a boat.


# **Fleet Captain Report**

Approval of minutes of last meeting and secretary comments: There were no changes to the last meeting's minutes and they were approved as presented.


Windword editor comment: Julie was absent tonight and the Windword deadline will be on July 10th.
