From the Treasurer

It's membership renewal time. The Secretary will be sending out membership renewals in late December. Please review the membership form for accuracy and completeness, make corrections if necessary, **sign and return it with your check for the entire amount due**. If you have not received your renewal form by January 15th please contact the Secretary to receive a replacement.

Some tips to help in the renewal process:

Remember that the person assigned a storage space is the one responsible for payment of fees. If you have a co-owner, please handle financial arrangements among yourselves, the Club is not party to or knowledgeable of your agreement.

Mail timely. We use the legible postmark date to measure timeliness. If you are mailing close to a deadline you should consider having the post office hand cancel the mailing to insure that it is readable.

Enclose your complete payment with your renewal form. While electronic bill pay is handy for some purposes, remember that they generally do not have dated postmarks and may take as long as 10 days to process and be received by us. Timeliness of renewal is based on receipt of both the <u>signed</u> form and <u>complete</u> payment of your dues and fees. Please do not try to use postdated checks. Incomplete forms will be returned. We do not accept credit cards due to the cost involved nor do we offer extended payment terms but we do offer the option to prepay your dues and fees in amounts of at least \$25 per payment.

Use the Club post office box. The box is checked daily during renewal season and all renewals received are processed daily. Use of any other address may result in delayed processing and possible loss. The post office box, processing office and bank branch are within a single square mile making for efficient timely handling.

If you are not renewing your membership, please let us know. An email or letter to the Secretary will be appreciated and help us avoid unnecessary mailings. Remember that if you are not renewing, your property must be removed from the Club prior to February 1st to avoid storage charges.

Treasurer report:

Tom reported we are still on schedule and no unexpected expenses. Budget has been reported and approved. In 2016 the club had 27 new members and 29 members/associate members discontinued. Discussion about what to do about the three boats left onsite but owners are not claiming them or joining the club. (i.e. Hunter 26 ft)

Vice Commodore report:

Drew has asked for update on D dock. IV said D Dock has major floatation issues on half of the floatation blocks and he is looking for prices on replacing Styrofoam blocks. We have reached weight limit on the dock but we don't think that is the issue. Bryan will also look for contacts to get more estimates on what can be done. We should consider using encapsulated foam to reduce pollution. A Dock has deterioration issues and floatation issues which is causing potential tripping issue. We need to fix direct hazards. Work party ideas are being discussed.

BOG Minutes Cont'd

Facility Manager report:

Kevin added 4th anchor to the Big Breakwater and is working on getting it more parallel to C Dock. Done with changes on D Dock. Reminder, hoist slip owner is responsible to fix their boards at their slip. A motion was made and accepted for club to make an offer of \$200 to purchase a steel tongue extension.

Activities Captain report:

Harvey and Marsha reported on Christmas Party this Saturday 6:30 pm, December 10th. The band is Creole Gumbo and they will set up at 4:00. As of today, 63 people have RSVP. Drew will MC the party and welcome everyone.

We are still looking for volunteer to fill this position. Starting 2017 this role will need to be filled.

Fleet Captain report:

Jon was not present.

Rear Commodore report:

Discussed budget for junior summer camp. Committee boat flooring will need to be replaced. Budgeted to replace one set of sails per year for 420 boats and keep the boats in good working order. We use them for adult and junior training. Winter chalkboard series will be offered possibly January through March. Schedules will be set soon. Wi-Fi weather station will be put in an adjacent property to club so we will have info such as wind, direction, etc. CPR training offered (but not required) for those who want it. Possibly in February. Will document the role of rear commodore so next person can have full understanding what has been done and the new direction we are working on.

Past Commodore report:

Marcus will schedule the Past Commodores meeting in February to discuss long term direction for Windycrest Sailing Club.
