I want to thank the Board of Directors for volunteering their time. We didn't always see eye to eye on every issue, but I believe vigorous debate results in good decisions and feel the club is going in the right direction.



A motion to approve Associate Membership applicant was seconded and approved.

The BOG members welcomed the new members and gave them an overview about the club.

There were no changes to the last meeting's minutes and they were approved as presented.

BOG Discussion on Windycrest Sailing Club Bylaws

John Kerr suggested the Steering Committee received advance notice (a month before) to review the changes to the Bylaws.

The fees that were included in Bylaws are being proposed to be separated outside of the Bylaws and the fees will then be determined by the Board of Governors. Members will receive notice prior to the change going into effect.

The Commodore proposed change to Article XIII, Sec 14: "Changes to fee schedule shall be made available to membership at least 20 days prior to the vote to adoption."

Discussion was made and BOG agreed to put back in to the Bylaws, Article XII, Sec 1 to keep in "dry storage space for one centerboard or catamaran."

Motion was made and seconded to accept amendments to the Bylaws.

40 people attended the Steak Dinner and 16 boats participated in regatta race including some boats from out of town.

Expect the laying of asphalt on road to Windycrest to be in late October or later in the fall.
