What We Are Doing?

The club needs a lot of maintenance since the high water last year prevented dock work and created more wear and tear on the Pavilion. We will be a lot of manual labor including lifting, scraping, painting, fixing, screwing, nailing, cleaning, et cetera. If you have a passion to lead the work in an area, please let me know beforehand.

The following list of work is planned:

Entrance

(electrician) Get the two lights working while supplying power to Barker Creek gate **Keelboat Lot** (Boat owners)

Maintenance Shop is off limits during work party! Straightening the shop will take place as a make-up assignment with Kevin's oversight

Upper Lot (Boat owners)

Paint A-Frame hoist structure grey Stain work bench beside hoist



Empty Trailer Lot (As assigned)

Load tree trimmings into dumpster (*Our club is not a dumping ground for your yard trimmings!*)

Do not weed trim around trailers due to potential damage to trailer wiring and lights Do not move trailers due to many tires not being maintained

North Lot (Boat owners)

(carpenter) Replace bottom two steps to building (2x10" 12')

Campground (Trailer owners)

Stain parking lot direction signs and club signs and paint red/yellow/white details

Lower Lot (Boat owners)

Fix broken window on shed

Patch steps (take mud out)

Bathrooms (As assigned on Saturday)

Top to bottom cleaning needed

To be determined for repairs and painting

Pavilion (As assigned on Saturday)

Scrape metal and paint railing, posts and stairwell on lower level (if time allows and plenty of help, then focus on upper level railing afterwards)

Stain picnic tables

Clean keg fridge and lines

Replace two hemp ropes

Clean fireplace and grills

Clean-up white board and bulletin board

Trim branches over road leading into Pavilion (if tree is dead)

A Dock (Slip lessees)

Boards need to shortened in width to remove trip hazard

Paint outlet posts grey

B Dock (Slip lessees)

Patch concrete (bring trowels if you have them)

Replace Jim buoy and paint yellow

Flip or replace 2x12s on end of dock

Repair loose boards on walkway

(welding) Railing need to be replaced

C Dock (Slip lessees)

Prep railing and walkway for later paint and stain (ask Cindy G. about fun colors planned for paint and stain)

Patch asphalt

Repair marked boardwalk (must finish all boards that are taken up before leaving!)

Throw 4 tires into dumpster

Replace last 3 boards under walkway

D Dock (Slip lessees)

Replace broken plasti-wood pieces on ramp

Paint ramp post grey

Clean empty moorings

Training Dock (Parents of youth sailors planning to attend sailing camp)

Paint railing grey

Replace two bottom 4x8 plywood sheets and paint white

420 bunk maintenance (replace and secure rollers and tie-downs as needed)

Scrub boat hulls

Replace any marked boards

Inventory equipment and organize sail loft

Parking Lot (As assigned on Saturday)

Using club truck, load coarse 6/7 rock and fill low spot at lot entrance

Shovel silt back and add top rap in front of culvert

Clean-up debris from flooding

Ramp

(masonry) Patch hump in ramp with Redi-mix (low water level permitting (lower than 728') - likely a make-up work task)

I Think I Earned Work Credit Last Year

So far I have ONE approved work credit from a volunteer running a race committee. Your credit is not automatic, you must request the credit **BEFORE** the work party. E-mail your work credit request to David Hyman (<u>fleet.captain@windycrest.com</u>) and if approved I will notify your credit has been approved.

Do You Have a Trade Skill?

The club needs workers skilled in carpentry, electrician, plumbing, masonry and welding workers.

I f you have any of these skills, please let me know in advance so I can reassign you to a particular job to lead a crew.
