Word from the Fleet Captain

Hello, Windysailors. Last week while sitting in my doctor's exam room, the nurse came to take my blood pressure. First thing she noticed was the beginning of my annual shirt tan and, being an awfully friendly nurse, she asked what I had been doing so early in the year to look so swarthy. "Sailing", I told her, "weekends on Keystone. Sometimes more often." "SPF? How much are you using?" she asked. "Zero. None." She dropped her arm with the squeeze bulb with a look she no doubt reserves for idiots and robocallers. "Hey, I don't burn, I tan," I argued. "You're an idiot," she replied, violating every patient relations rule at the hospital. "Why? What do you mean?" "Just because you don't burn doesn't mean you won't get skin cancer – melanoma – surely you've heard of that. It can kill you. Is that worth a sexy tan? Is it, Idiot? Smart people quit laying out in the sun in the 90's." So then the wise nurse set me straight: The Skin Cancer Foundation recommends a water-resistant, broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher for any extended outdoor activity. Regardless of the SPF, though, it's important to apply one ounce (two tablespoons) 30 minutes before going outside and reapply it every two hours or immediately after swimming or sweating. OK, public service announcement made, it's on to Windycrest racing. As I am sure everyone now knows, the club's Sailing Instructions were somewhat revised this year. What? You didn't know that? Go look in the new directory – it's all there. Over the winter, a smart ad hoc committee pored over the existing SIs to, first, make sure that they did not conflict with the new 2017-2020 Racing Rules of Sailing, and, second, to make any other improvements that seemed appropriate. Three of those changes have already drawn attention and comment from member racers: the starting sequence for Wednesday night races (Paragraph 5.6); the keelboat handicap fleet designations (Paragraph 5.4); and our method of shortening the racecourse (Paragraph 13). Previous club sailing instructions designated the order of class starts for Wednesday night races. Under the new SI, starting order is left to the discretion the PRO, who can set the order of starts depending on present conditions. Also, in the past couple of years, we had three keelboat handicap fleets, "A", "B" and "Dirty Bottom". While the inclusion of the Dirty Bottom fleet encouraged racers without hydrohoists to show up on the line dragging their algae, it also caused a lot of confusion as those DB boats improved and became more competitive. So, the new SI designates two fleets, "Spinnaker" and "Non-Spinnaker." Last, the new SI changes the course shortening rule consistent with the analogous rule in the RRS.

All that said, no change is perfect and no rule is beyond improvement with experience. In the best arrangement, our sailing rules would be reviewed regularly in an orderly and thoughtful manner with the aim of making them work as well as possible. In olden times this was ably done by the permanent "Windycrest Racing Rules Committee" (or named something like that). But there is no permanent committee like that now and we need one very much. So, I am asking for a few good sailors to make our racing program hum with good, appropriate, workable rules. Please email me as soon as you can if you would be willing to help out. Free pizza.

Boat Identification

Boat Registration. Just a reminder that boat registrations expire on June 30. There is no penalty for renewals by July 31. Since you are not notified of expiration unless you make a positive election with the Oklahoma Tax Commission, check that you are up to date and have a current registration sticker on your boat. It is very helpful to us and the Lake Patrol if we need to locate you.

Boat trailer identification. Please make sure your legible name is on your trailer tongue. Having your name on the trailer enables us to easily identify boat owners in case we need to contact you regarding your boat.

Some tips to help the volunteers at Club functions

If reservations are requested, please reserve early. The reservations system helps the planners purchase appropriate amounts of food and beverages, schedule workers and enables everyone to concentrate on having fun. Don't expect to be served food if you didn't make a reservation.

Bring exact change if possible. The price for events is known in advance. Having correct change or a check enables the check in crew to concentrate on registration and not on making change. If exact change is not available, **please** no bills larger than \$20. Paying an under \$20 charge with a \$100 bill makes life difficult for the check in crew. Do not ask to be billed, we are not a commercial operation and billing is not an option.

Remember that volunteers at Club functions are giving up their time so that everyone can enjoy the event. Treat them as you would like to be treated.
