

Let's Do It Again SAIL FOR STEVE – WSC CHARITY REGATTA 2018 September 8, 2018



Please contact Vice Commodore or Rear Commodore to volunteer for either of these positions.

Sec. 5. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all Club meetings, permanent records of all Club activities, and conduct all Club correspondence. The secretary will compile and distribute to all members a complete list of active members as of March 15th of the current year.

The Club Secretary needs be available to attend all meetings of the BOG and any additional meetings as called by an Club Officer past or present to record what was done in the meeting. Club Secretary works with Treasurer to produce annual dues and fees renewals. Club Secretary maintains an Excel Workbook and uses the workbook to create annual Club Directory.

Sec. 8 The Activities Captain shall be responsible for the development and planning of Club social functions and non-racing sailing activities (except junior programs and training programs).

The Activities Captain works with the various Fleets to create social calendar for the year including which Fleet(s) or BOG will host each events. Then passes the calendar information along to Secretary, Windword Editor, and Webmaster for publication. During the year, the Activities Captain ensures Fleets are prepared for hosting their event, and coordinates any needs if necessary. Assists Fleets with budget and if needed approval for expenditures with the BOG. The Activities Captain may also run a Ships Store either online with orders, or at events selling stock and taking orders.

I revere those that rise to the pinnacle of Star boat racing, and the general beauty of the boat when well sailed, but what particularly draws me to the Class is the members that make it all happen. And a LOT happens in the Star Class.

I had the opportunity to work race committee at the World Cup Series Miami for the past few years with a fellow from Tulsa, OK. He talks funny, and he says the same about me. We had some time to kill while it was a quite windy day this past regatta, and talk got around to Stars.

He told me of Steve, a Tulsa local, who had won a National Championship in Catalina 22s, was an active Snipe sailor, and owns and loves Star #6025. He has introduced hundreds of people in his little slice of paradise to the beauty of sailing in general, and of Star boats in particular over the years.





But Steve was stricken with ALS a few years ago, and is unfortunately not able to sail now. His home Club has an annual charity regatta that has been recently christened as Sailing for Steve, with proceeds going to the ALS Foundation. I thought that the participants in Miami's Star Winter Series (in which I have a recurring role) could do something nice for Steve. So....

John MacCausland provided a Star Class warning flag, Coral Reef Yacht Club provided additional artwork and some sharpies, and the 40-odd skippers and their crews (and Race Committee members!) at the <u>Walker Cup/Midwinters Regatta</u> dinner enthusiastically provided autographs on said flag, labeled Stars for Steve.

There was a longer line to sign the flag than there was for the bar!

While I personally revere those that take home all the marbles in the most competitive one-design keelboat in the world, I am deeply honored to be a member

of this Class. Truly first-class all the way. Honoring the past, leading the future has a very deep meaning.

I'm told that when Steve received the flag, he called his crew and co-owner of #6025 to come over right away, and they all broke out the good scotch for the first time in months. How much better does it get?

The above story represents the great people that are involved in sailing. A small token of caring, signing a flag to be given to someone you might not even know, can mean something so special. You can show you care too.

My appeal for you today is to plan to sail in the Sail for Steve Regatta. Each year when planning this event Steve has always says that he would love to see a hundred boats out there. 
Remember that volunteers at Club functions are giving up their time so that everyone can enjoy the event. Treat them as you would like to be treated.
