

From the Fleet Captain:

The 2019 Windycrest Frostbite series was a qualified success. "Qualified" because Mother Nature did Her level best to give us only two good days to sail during this winter event. Of the five scheduled Frostbite sailing days, three of them were too much like the Roaring Forties, so we cancelled in deference to good sense. However, the other two days were beautiful on Lake Keystone. We set a seven mile course with the starting line in the mouth of Windycrest cove with a beat to the Corps of Engineers buoys at the 412 bridge, then a long spinnaker run/reach Northward around the bend to another permanent buoy on the West side of the lake, and then another beat/reach back to the club. Once the dozen or so boats were back at the docks, everyone came to the pavilion for hot cider, beer, pie, cakes, soft drinks, and whatever else the Fleet Captain thought to provide. It seemed to be fun enough to warrant another Frostbite series again next winter to tempt Mother Nature once more. Thanks to Tobie Bresloff for many trips to Costco for the eats and for the hours in the kitchen concocting the fine hot apple cider.

We presented awards for the 2018 racing season at the recent annual Awards Party. Instead of sending winners home with plastic sailboats on plastic bases with plastic labels, this year we commended the winners with embroidered polo shirts and sailing books for the winning skippers and shirts for winning crews. 

Come to the club. You paid your dues so use your boat.



Fleet Captain Report:

PRO training is scheduled for March 23rd and is mandatory to be a PRO on race committee, in addition to performing two race committee duties.

There are still four spots open needing a PRO for the 2019 racing series.

The St. Patrick's Day regatta is scheduled for March 16th and will be the season opener for racing. 9:30 am breakfast, 11:00 am skippers meeting, 12:00 pm start. At least four races are anticipated, for keel boats only.

The Frost Bite series was considered a success for the two that were held, three races were canceled due to weather.

Commodore:

An invitation will be sent to approximately 40 club members to form a committee to review a list of club issues such as publicity for the club, ways to increase and keep up membership, evaluate necessary repairs and maintenance, club improvements and potential costs.

Wind and wave action recently caused damage, with one HydroHoist destroying a portion of D dock.

Skeeter asked everyone to help remind members to regularly check on their boats. The motors on the club owned motorboats need to be kept down in the water and in a vertical position to keep cooling water in the motor from freezing and causing damage.

The gas to the heater in the Men's Restroom was turned off, which resulted in frozen water pipes. The heater does have an open flame with no immediate flue apparent next to the heater, but there is plenty of ventilation in the area so a separate flue is not necessary. Board members were asked to help educate people to never turn off the gas.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm. The next meeting will be on **April 1**st, no fooling, at the Case Community Center at 6:30 pm.
